Teddy Bear Class:

“Potty Training”

Potty training must begin in the home and in conjunction with your child's teachers, we will observe and look for cues that your child is ready, such as physically (have bladder capacity and muscle control), cognitively (be aware of what is expected), and emotionally (be comfortable to give up the diaper process). Here are a few things to keep in mind:

Observe for readiness signs: Look for signs like your child showing interest in using the potty and teach them the words for number 1 and number 2, whatever you prefer.

Make it fun: Sing potty songs, read potty training books, or use a potty training doll to make the experience enjoyable.

Follow a consistent routine: This will help your child anticipate when they need to go and make it easier for them to learn.

Be patient: Potty training takes time, and setbacks are common

Busy Bee Class:

Dear Families,

As Spring arrives we hope you and your children are enjoying the warmer weather and longer days. We're excited to share upcoming events and activities, including Springtime Gardening in our own play yard. Here is an overview of what is to come: Our Curriculum unit will be this month: Springtime activities; such as planting, digging, looking for bugs etc. These skills will foster a sense of wonder in the natural world. Children will learn to plant seeds in our Garden and take turns watering the plants daily, and learning how to nature, take care of plants and vegetables that we grow and then taste them. Children will have the opportunity to engage in: Language, Arts & Crafts,

Songs, texture, soil and dirt, counting and Measuring as they will take real time observations.

Brown Bear Class:

Hello Brown Bear Families,

As we welcome this new month we ask that you check your emails often, as they will have lots of additional information. If you are not receiving the emails see one of the classroom teachers as soon as possible. This month we will be reviewing all the letters of the alphabet and the sounds they make, please practice with your child at home. We will be learning through hands-on experiences about recycling, rain, rainbows, spring, plants and gardening with an emphasis on encouraging the children to ask questions about their environment and learn how to protect it. As a classroom experiment we will be hatching butterflies and monitoring their phase changes right inside the classroom for all of us to observe and take note of their growth.

TK/ Kindergarten Class:

Language Arts: children will learn to identify Nouns and Verbs. Understanding nouns and verbs is crucial for building strong sentences, improving communication, and grasping the fundamental structure of language, enabling clear and effective expression.

Math: Geometry: 2D and 3D shapes. Children will identify and name each shape, count its sizes and vertices. They will have an opportunity to play and build with shapes and will make connections with shapes of real-world objectives. Learning about 2D and 3D shapes help children develop spatial reasoning, visual skills and an understanding of the world around them.

Science: ongoing planning in planting our garden in our school, identifying and exploring plants that we eat and the foods that come from different plants. Also, we will be learning about Animal Life Cycle Types and Stages. Understand the basic definition

of animals and explore what they need to stay alive, attributes, where they live, how they adapt to their environment and explore relationships between people and animals.

Social Studies: children will learn about Leaders such as; introducing the constitution, citizens; a member of a country and about the rights of voting, how people from other countries become citizens and how they have the right to vote by their choice.
